
PW Farmers' Market Beginning June 7



For fresh, locally-grown, organic produce and specialty items, the Port Washington Organic Farmers' Market is the place to be! Now in its twelfth year, the Market founded and managed by Grassroots Environmental Education, is the only 100% organic farmers' market in New York State. Farmers from the East End bring truckloads of fresh vegetables. Local bakers offer fantastic breads, cakes and organic coffee (with organic milk and sucanat). Hot organic blueberry muffins, eggs, goat cheese and honey are popular with market regulars.

Grassroots cultivates and manages a small organic farm at the Dodge Family Farm, here in Port, growing vegetables for the local food bank and for the Farmers' Market.

The Sands Point Preserve's apiary produced 100 pounds of pure Guggenheim Estate Golden Honey last year - and it is now waking for a third year pollinating the beautiful gardens and natural woods across the preserve's 216 acres.
