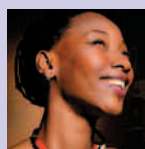
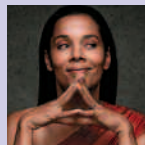

## Special Tree Planting Ceremony in Manorhaven

Manorhaven Trustee Priscilla von Roeschlaub is proud to invite the public to a very special tree planting ceremony in celebration of Arbor Day on Sat., April 25 at 10 am, at the trailhead located off Manorhaven Blvd. The ceremony, honoring the victims and survivors of the devastation will include the Brownies planting seedlings and reciting Joyce Kilmer's poem, "Trees."

The tree, a callery pear, is the direct descendant of the only tree left standing at "ground zero" after the bombing of the World Trade Center on 9/11/2001. The lone survivor had only one leaf. It was rescued, nursed back to health and transplanted to Van Cortlandt Park. Later, it was moved to the new World Trade Center Memorial Park. This seedling was made available to the Village by Bartlett Tree Experts, who cared for the WTC tree and its offspring. The tree is about 3-4 feet tall and could grow as high as 30-35 feet.

Trustee von Roeschlaub, Chair of the Manorhaven Village Tree Committee, credited the acquisition of the tree to committee member Henry Young. She commented, "It is not about death. It's about birth, about going on, about being able to flower again." Other committee members are Dolores Kazanjian O'Brien and Jennifer Wilson Pines.

## From the Fires: Voices of the Holocaust, April 14

Theatre Three's acclaimed production of *From the Fires: Voices of the Holocaust*, written and directed by Jeffery E. Sanzel, will be performed at The Community Synagogue on April 14, at 6:45 pm.

The play traces the life of Rachel Gold, a Berlin teenager, and her experiences from 1937 to 1945 - following her from the inception of the Nuremberg Laws through deportation to Auschwitz and finally the death march to Mauthausen. Now in its 19th anniversary year, Theatre Three's production of *From The Fires* has been seen by over 100,000 people.

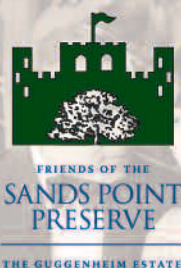
