Town of North Hempstead Cuts Ribbon on Hempstead Harbor Shoreline Trail

North Hempstead Town Supervisor Judi Bosworth, the Town Board, various elected officials and community groups joined to officially open the newly-expanded Hempstead Harbor Shoreline Trail. The trail which begins at North Hempstead Beach Park and runs south adjacent to West Shore Road, was previously one quartermile long from May Newburger Cove to the first overlook, but has now been expanded by one mile, making it 1.25 miles long.

This is the culmination of nearly a decade of applying for grant funding and acquiring land to make the trail's expansion a reality. Construction on the project began in January 2014 and was completed by Galvin Brothers, with the engineering done by GEI Consultants.

"It is so thrilling to have our very own nature trail right here in North Hempstead where residents can walk, jog or hike," said Supervisor Bosworth, who has made revitalization of the waterfront one of her top priorities. "This trail expansion is a wonderful start to what I hope will be a continuing effort to develop our waterfront thoughtfully. I look forward to continuing to work with all levels of government and our environmentally-minded community groups as we strive to make Hempstead Harbor one of the most exciting waterfront destinations on Long Island."

The meandering path is lined with benches, native plants and a bridge.

Sections of the trail are handicapped accessible. The Hempstead Harbor Protection Committee (HHPC) provided signs about nature and wildlife that are placed at overlook points.

Eric Swenson, Executive Director of the HHPC said, "Shoreline trails provide an excellent and easy way for the public to access and enjoy their waterfronts. Hempstead Harbor is fortunate not only to have a good portion of its shores publically-owned, but to have several waterfront trails."

Carol DiPaolo, Programs Director of the Coalition to Save Hempstead Harbor, said "The completion of the trail following the wetlands restoration on the harbor's western shore marks another outstanding improvement for Hempstead Harbor. The trail provides a great educational opportunity by affording community residents access to the water's edge so they can observe the shore birds and marine life that depend on the harbor for their habitat."

The cost of the trail was completed with the aid of a \$100,000 grant from the 2004 Nassau County Bond Act and a \$271,000 grant from NY State Parks, "I am pleased that the County has been able to secure funding to assist with this project," Legislator Delia DeRiggi-Whitton said. "There are few places more beautiful to walk along than Hempstead Harbor's shoreline. I am confident that many people will enjoy



From The Publisher

He who doesn't toot his own horn, doesn't get it tooted...

This was the response when an anthropology instructor asked a student to put into his own words a rather longwinded description of how leaders get to be known, or not known.

I was reminded of this when

we received a copy of a letter sent to a publication about what the author viewed as a gross lack of coverage at an event. In other words they did not get the coverage they felt was their due.

For everyone who wants editorial coverage and those who feel their favorite vendor, club, organization, etc. should get coverage, let me provide a couple of hints on getting it done.

Most publications have a fraction of the editorial staff prevalent just a few years ago... Reporters and editors stretched about as thin as possible and are often reduced to simply taking in copy



and rerunning it. This isn't the best scenario, but it is accurate... and it provides a great opportunity for those desiring editorial coverage.

Simply, make certain you know what the focus coverage of your target publication. Then provide your article in an electronic file, preferably with a Hi-res photo, illustration or logo (picking a photo off the web doesn't work). An editor working on a deadline will love it and you have a much better chance of coverage. Try to avoid sending a flyer, window poster, or inside newsletter article. These all require time and effort and diminish your chances of accurate coverage. You should also write your article in the third person so it doesn't look like a puff piece (quotes in quotes can make it a bit more personal). As we put this issue of the

Port Washington Calendar together, we are surprised at the lack of articles received from HarborFest Participants. Dozens of booths being taken by both commercial and not for profits, and we have very little to tell attendees about your booth, your offerings, or the value of stopping by your booth.

Finally, if you find all of this difficult and/or complicated, just refer back to the headline of this column.
