Cow Neck Historical Society Announces Sands-Willets House Modified Tour Dates for 2015

Due to preparation for a major costume exhibit. due to open in the fall, tours of Sands-Willets House will be limited to May 3, May 17, June 7 at 2 pm sharp. The docent lead tour lasts about an hour. The suggested donation for tours is \$5.

The Cow Neck Historical Society maintains the Sands-Willets House, part of which dates from the early 1700s, as a museum and educational center. Located in the Incorporated Village of Flower Hill, the house is typical of the Long Island farmhouses that grew to fit the need of the families who lived in them.

The Sands-Willets House has 18 rooms, 11 of which are furnished and open to the public. The

Sands family, merchants, farmers, and Patriot leaders, built and lived in the house from 1735 to 1845. Colonel John Sands II. served in Washington's army. The Willets family, prominent in Quaker affairs. owned the homestead from 1845 to 1967. Edmund Willets was active in the abolition movement prior to the Civil War.

The house is a Village of Flower Hill Historic Landmark and is also listed on the State and National Registers of Historic Places.
