

PUBLISHER'S COLUMN

Good News and Bad News

We all seem to go through the same ritual each year. It is a New Year... and we are going to break an old habit and/or develop a new one. "Beginning January 2 (I always leave room for New Year's Day) we will quit - smoking, eating dessert, falling asleep in front of the TV. Or, we will lose weight, walk for 30 minutes each morning, get up an hour earlier to get a jump on the day or read one book each week."

This is a nice ritual, we feel good about the decision, and by the end of January we will have developed this change into a habit.

Everyone knows you can develop, or break a habit in 21 to 30 days, Right? That's the Good News...now for the Bad News...It ain't necessarily so!

We did a bit of exploring on the web and came up with more information on this annual ritual.

The origins of the myth that it takes 21 days to form a new habit can be traced back to the 1950s. Plastic surgeon Maxwell Maltz noticed that when he performed operations it took patients about 21 days to get used to seeing their new situation. Finally, he noticed that when he tried to form a new habit himself, it took him – you guessed it - about 21 days to do so. He then wrote in his 1960 book Psych-Cybernetics, "These, and many other commonly observed phenomena tend to show that it requires a minimum of about 21 days for an old mental image to dissolve and a new one to iell.'

Over time, that little tidbit became common knowledge - but with one crucial difference: The words "a minimum" got dropped. Hence: The myth of 21 days.

In 2010, University College London conducted a study aimed at getting to the bottom of the question of how long it really takes us to develop a new habit. The researchers found that it took, on average, 66 days until the behavior reached peak

So, in our fit of enthusiasm, maybe we should recognize that our resolutions will be habits by St. Patrick's Day... or not. What the heck, Enjoy the year!
