

The Future of the Hempstead Harbor Sand Pits A Community Meeting to Help Protect this Resource



Join the Port Washington community in a growing movement to help protect the Hempstead Harbor Sand Pits. A presentation on the environmental resources of the Hempstead Harbor Nature Sanctuary will be given by local environmental expert, David Jakim, will take place in the Port Library's Hagedorn Room on Wednesday, April 6, from 7 - 8:30 pm. The presentation will be followed by an open community meeting to network and join the effort to help protect the area.

Very few people are aware of the fact that this astonishingly large and abundant natural habitat exists on the Port Washington Peninsula. In fact, at 240 acres, this area is the largest natural habitat on the Peninsula. Formerly known as the Hempstead Harbor Sand Pits and henceforth referred to as the Hempstead Harbor Nature Sanctuary (HHNS), the area supports the greatest diversity of flora, fauna, and biological communities on the peninsula. The HHNS also contains Port Washington's largest freshwater wetland and is therefore an important part of Port's groundwater system. However, this pristine natural ecosystem is in danger because of multiple ongoing environmental harms and risks that include development, water pollution, ATV use, invasive species, and human disturbance.


