Fresh omelets, bacon, sausage, and more are also being served and there will be live music, a raffle and face painting. This annual event brings together community residents of all ages for good food, fellowship and fun.

The breakfast is hosted to raise funds for charitable purposes primarily within the Port Washington community. The Lions place particular emphasis on assisting individuals with vision loss. They support the Guide Dog Foundation for the Blind, the Lions Eye Bank of Long Island, assist those with hearing loss, and organize eyeglass recycling programs. 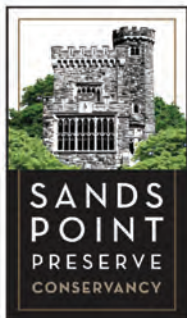
