In 1962, it was adapted into an Oscar award winning musical film starring Robert Preston, Shirley Jones as Marian and a very young Ron Howard as Marian's little brother Winthrop.

The Community Chest has selected Dr. George Williams, PhD as the 2017 Citizen of the Year for his remarkable contributions to the Port Washington Community. He will be honored at a ceremony on Monday, April 24, at 7 pm in the Lapham Room of the PW Public Library.

Dr. Williams was a history and English teacher from 1973 to 1990 in the PW Public School District, was on the Town Landmarks Preservation Committee from 1984 to 2015, was the historian and Landmarks Preservation Commissioner from 1975-2015 for Village of PW North. He was a Oral History Project contributor in the PW Public Library, a member of the Town of N. Hempstead Historical Society and the historian and board member for The Sandminer's Monument.

The Citizen of the year award recognizes "a lifetime of outstanding volunteer service on behalf of the citizens of Port Washington" and has been awarded annually since 1969. The ceremony and reception are free and all members of the community are invited to attend.

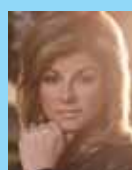

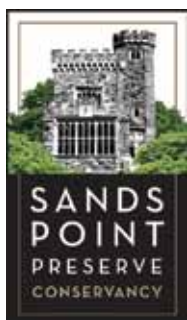
