He was a Oral History Project contributor in the PW Public Library, a member of the Town of N. Hempstead Historical Society and the historian and board member for The Sandminer's Monument.

The Citizen of the year award recognizes "a lifetime of outstanding volunteer service on behalf of the citizens of Port Washington" and has been awarded annually since 1969. The ceremony and reception are free and all members of the community are invited to attend.
