





It is the one that appears regularly on TV. It is for a product that seems to be a prescription drug that will make my skin look like a teenager's (without the pimples, I trust). It is called XXXX (oops, lawyers again). The voice over provides all the standard possible reactions including some we usually relate to someone living on the streets.

The final line of warning, and proof we have gone over the edge, is "Do not to take XXXX if you are allergic to XXXX".

Terrific! We have now reached the point of no return. When do we say not to use a lawyer as you could be liable for legal decisions.

I know you have seen these disclaimers and conditions. They appear across the bottom of the ad and are normally in soft grey type on a background of a similar color. The same system is used on junk emails to hide the possibility of unsubscribing.

I don't know about you but I am almost afraid to try any new product for fear of a deadly reaction which, of course, was 'covered' in the products promotion.

It seems to me that the conditions of sale should be at least as obvious as the offers themselves.
