#### Whose Money Is It?



Charitable and environmental efforts are alive and well in Port. It is almost impossible to walk or drive along Main Street or Port Boulevard without being inundated with one good cause or another.

It may be true that so many good things are happening and developing in Port that we become a bit numb to the whole subject.

One might also suggest we each begin to categorize the various charities and not-for-

profits as to their importance and worth as seen by and through our own eyes.

I am no different but, I am crazy enough to do that categorization in this column. In general I do have some broad views on the subject, like the different meanings of Grant. Money (Grant) donated to not-for-profits and other charitable and environmental issues are great. They represent good citizenship by the presenting organizations and individuals.

On the other hand I am skeptical of Grants coming from political entities. Too often we hear of one or more elected officials making headlines by providing a Grant for this or that. No matter how worthy the cause this activity is simply an artificial method of

giving taxpayer money without a vote being taken. More disturbing is the whole business of government to government Grants. The Federal Government gives a Grant to the State, the State gives Grants to the County and the County gives Grants to the Town.

All of this is simply taxpayer money being used primarily to get votes and to avoid the horrible job of justifying the actual expenditure. Yes, I recognize that not all projects can be funded at a local level, but it seems there is a better way of financing those projects than making them appear as largess from big daddy.

A recent example was in the papers a few days ago. A local government wrote a Grant to get a Grant from somewhere else to pay for a plaque costing about \$1000. If the plaque and the expenditure were worthwhile, and I suspect it was, why go through all the exercise to write a Grant proposal, etc.? Why not simply buy the darned thing?

I do not know how much money is spent on Grants by our various governing bodies here in New York, but it would be an interesting project.

Maybe I can get a Grant to do the study...hmmm.
