Another excuse bites the dust.



Yep... the Supreme Court has just ruled that every state has the right to collect sales tax on any sale made to you. IE: Amazon, and anyone else must charge NY sales tax whether or not they have a facility in New York State.

For a long time merchants have been able to blame the sales tax exclusion on internet sales for much of their declining business. Conversely shoppers like you

have been able to brag that they 'saved the tax' by shopping on line.

What happens now is up to us and our local merchants. As consumers we need to take another look at the whole concept of 'SHOP LOCAL' and re-evaluate the trade-offs vs online purchases. One obvious trade off is that local merchants support our local organizations and activities while the online businesses simply take our money.

On the other hand I am not proposing a 'free ride' for our merchants. They also need to re-evaluate how they approach their business by posting hours that make sense. More important, they need to actually open and close based on the hours posted. It might be useful to begin to upgrade their inventory and the ambience of their shops. Some look just terrific, but too many look like they gave up a long time ago. And, I might as well say it, maybe some will begin to advertise on a regular basis again.

We are not proposing everything happen overnight. Everyone knows the harm inflicted on local business took a long time to be felt.

My thought is that this single change by the SCOTUS, as they call it, could begin to level the field for our merchants and be a catalyst for change... for the better.


