



Yet is surprising how many details had to be sorted out during a most difficult time. This included everything from the clothing for the deceased to the writing of the obituary. All of this may seem like normal concerns except they all seem to come together quickly and need immediate response during a time of grieving,

So, just maybe we should each put together our own book of lists for each member of the family. The hospital asks a million questions if an adult, or child, has a simple accident. Maybe your list could help smooth out a difficult time... and also having your lists together just might make you feel good.


