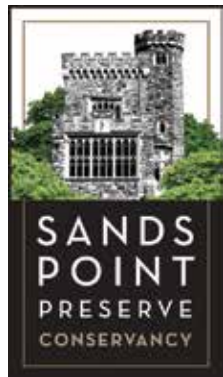

The two incidents were totally unrelated. We had a minor fender bender with the car and, more important, a friend passed. His passing was not unexpected and that simply adds to our thoughts.

A long time ago Marie and I considered developing a list of items to 'remember' when traveling. From there we came up with the idea of a book of lists... and it still seems like a good idea.

In addition to the list of items to have should a hospital visit be necessary, it seems that maintaining a list of items for the glove compartment may be equally valuable. Yes, we all have the paper insurance 'cards.' But do we eliminate all the old ones when adding the new one? Sorting through the old cards, and the old registrations, etc. is not only inconvenient when the police are asking for the ID, it is frustrating at best. Maybe a check list would help.

Finally, regarding the passing of our friend: as I say, it was not unexpected and he was good at planning and details. Yet is surprising how many details had to be sorted out during a most difficult time. This included everything from the clothing for the deceased to the writing of the obituary. All of this may seem like normal concerns except they all seem to come together quickly and need immediate response during a time of grieving.

So, just maybe we should each put together our own book of lists for each member of the family. The hospital asks a million questions if an adult, or child, has a simple accident. Maybe your list could help smooth out a difficult time... and also having your lists together just might make you feel good.
